This is an application to extend the time granted for curing the defects.

The facts of the case are that the Appellant filed the Memo of Appeal on 19.12.2019 and the Office after scrutiny of the Memo of Appeal on 20.12.2019, intimated the defects and returned the Memo of Appeal to the Appellant on the same day. The Appellant re-filed the Memo of Appeal on 06.01.2020.
